A labyrinth is a spiritual and meditative tool. While the labyrinth in the First United garden is always available for your use, these warm and humid summer days could be a deterrent. To see what it might be like to make use of a labyrinth as a spiritual tool, you're invited to use the finger labyrinth printed below. Prior to entering the labyrinth, whether with your finger or your feet, set an intention to focus yourself. Release your stress, anger, or frustration. As you approach the center, quiet your mind, listen, be open, and let the spirit guide the process, as the walk draws you closer to God. Then reflect on your devotional walk as you follow the path out and reconnect with your daily life.
