

MEET THE INTERIM PASTORAL SEARCH TEAM

Since early July, the members of the Interim Pastoral Search team have been diligently meeting to get moving on the process of finding an interim lead pastor. They met with our Committee on Ministry Transitional Liaison from the Presbytery, as well as with the Associate Conference Minister for Pastoral Transitions from the Illinois Conference of the UCC.

Next, the team will revise the church profiles that we used in 2018 in preparation for posting them to the electronic search systems for each denomination. The Presbytery has just redone their search system as of this June, and we will be one of the first churches to go through the new system. The UCC shared with us that the process for being matched to an intentional interim minister is nowhere as involved as that for a settled permanent lead pastor. Both denominations are aware of our desire to get the right interim pastor for our church in as timely a manner as is possible.

As advised by the UCC, the search team members have entered into a covenant relationship with each other around their work, including "confidentiality about personal and professional matters." This means that they will maintain confidentiality and cannot give you detailed information about their meetings or search progress other than the regular reports to the congregation. They won't even share details with Council outside of those necessary to move the process along by the approval of profiles and contracts.

Please remember that the team members have volunteered to serve God and our congregation by joining this committee, and please help them to honor the confidentiality commitments they have made to the process. The members of the Interim Pastoral Search team are:


Bobby is not new to Chicago having previously studied at North Park University. Please join us in welcoming Bobby on Sunday and stay after worship for some sweet treats in his honor!


A Life Saving Opportunity

For 41 years, Harriet has worked as a pediatric nurse at Lurie Children's Hospital, specializing in neonatal critical care and emergency care. Her passion for medical mission work has taken her all over the world where she has trained doctors, physician assistants, nurses, and midwives. She has also helped set up and provided clinical care to rural communities. How lucky for us that she is taking the time out of her crazy, busy schedule to train us!

The CPR classes are scheduled for Tuesday, August 15 and will include adult, child, and infant CPR and AED use as well as use of intranasal Narcan. The class will be approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes long.

Help Local Asylum Seekers

Several folks from First United have asked how to help "nuestros vecinos," the many Venezuelan families who are seeking legal asylum and temporarily living at the 15th District Police Station in nearby Austin. These families are sleeping in police stations while they wait for shelter space to become available. Presently in the 15th District, there are 30 adults and 17 children under 13 years old, and they have lived there for more than a month.

These station residents' survival needs, including daily food, water, clothing, and bedding, are being met completely by a volunteer team, the Police Station Response Team for District 15 (WhatsApp group).
